

A Word from Daryl Roberts President and Founder, LIVE2540








2023 was a pivotal year for our healthcare initiatives. In 2019, we first started providing Plumpy'Nut packets to ELWA Hospital in Liberia. Our team felt a united call to shift our time, resources and efforts towards a greater investment in the pediatric healthcare space. Over the past four years, our collective community of givers has joined us with hearts of compassion to grow this dream.

LIVE254O is now the top provider of malnutrition supplements in Liberia, West Africa. Lives are being saved every single day thanks to you.

This journey has expanded into a project that will see healthcare provided for over 30,000 children each year. In 2021, we broke ground on the Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic, and this year, we are moving into the final phase. Even now, as you read this report, hundreds of children are being served at the small on-site clinic - children who once had no access to healthcare.

It is home to dozens of remote villages and a population of over 300,000. Thousands of children living in Bong County's underdeveloped villages suffer from preventable and treatable medical conditions that contribute to weakened immune systems and a failure to thrive. This includes malaria, which can be treated for less than \$5 in a quality clinic. The Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic will provide top quality medical care that is entirely free of cost for each pediatric patient, but the mission goes far beyond just medicine. The staff at the clinic are not just employees - they are missionaries, committed to praying for and sharing the love of Jesus with each child, mother and father who enter for treatment. Kula and Destiny

JESUS LOVES ME CHILDREN'S CLINIC

"Because of the hospital, my daughter stays alive," Kula tells us, as she rocks her daughter, Destiny. We sit on the edge of the Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic construction site in a small pavilion serving for now as the outpatient area.


This clinic means so much to Kula because she knows what it is like to face a world without healthcare options for her children. Before Destiny, Kula had another daughter. When this daughter grew sick, there was nowhere nearby to take her. Kula traveled a great distance and expended her resources to bring her daughter to a hospital outside of Gbarnga, but it was too late.

Stories of loss like these bring an instant stab of pain, but they also remind us why this work - bringing a clinic to a place without healthcare options - is so critical.

Hundreds of mothers, like Kula, and their children, like Destiny, are already coming by motorcycle and on foot to receive healthcare. We stand back and watch as they are given medicine to treat their malaria for the first time before it becomes severe. Babies with a rattling cough are cared for until they can breathe air into their lungs again. Healing is happening in this place before the doors of the clinic even open.

"I just want to be thankful to God for you," Kula says, as she holds Destiny's hands in her own.

We're grateful too - grateful to be a part of God's work happening on the ground in Bong County, Liberia, grateful to be able to receive more and more children the day the clinic doors open wide for the first time, and grateful for everyone who collectively makes this life-saving work possible.





Fighting Malnutrition

The current rate of severe cases of malnutrition in Liberia is dire and the needs are growing. This year, the five and under ward we support at ELWA Hospital saw more children than ever before. Fortunately, thanks to your support, we were able to ensure that ELWA Hospital and the Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic were never without malnutrition supplements to serve these children.

In January, Daryl Roberts and 254O Mission Partner, Gordon Tipton, made an emergency trip to Nutriset, our supplier of therapeutic milks and Plumpy Nut, in France, to acquire and expedite delivery of desperately needed supplies. This shipment arrived just in time to provide some of the only malnutrition supplements in the country.




CHART SHOWS PACKETS OF PLUMPY'NUT DISTRIBUTED

Our commitment to ELWA Hospital's five and under ward remains a top priority going into 2024.

We have been working closely with Dr. Mikey Bryant, the pediatric clinical lead at ELWA Hospital. He never wastes an opportunity to extend his gratitude to the supporters of LIVE254O, who keep the shelves stocked with life-saving supplies.

Dr. Mikey reflects, "The continued increase in numbers of children admitted remains a reflection of the positive reputation of the program in the community as well as the challenges faced by other facilities. While other facilities often lack dedicated staff and well-managed supply chains for their pediatric ward and emergency room, thanks to your support, stockouts of medication have largely been avoided."

This is a huge step in the right direction, given the obstacles and economic infrastructure the doctors, nurses, and non-profits like LIVE254O are up against in Liberia. A common saying in Liberia is, "it's not easy o," and there is much truth to that statement.

Still, as we collectively support ELWA's ongoing medical efforts, we will witness more and more children heal and come to know Christ, which ultimately gives us the key to overcoming the world.



Our Pillars: Education



To ensure children have access to an education that will enrich their lives and serve their future.

Each year, over 300 children, teenagers, and young adults in Liberia will wake up in the morning, put on their uniforms, and head to school on scholarship, thanks to your support!

In Liberia, access to education remains a significant challenge. In 2019, around 47% of school-aged children were not enrolled in school. This means that nearly half of the children in Liberia are missing out on the opportunity to receive an education. Young girls are affected the most, with a 73% dropout rate before 5th grade.

This year, we sent more children back to school on scholarship than ever before. Our school in Balama is growing tremendously with the addition of a senior high annex, and kids of all ages are receiving an education central to their future.

Throughout the month of September, you helped us raise over \$25,000 dollars to provide an updated classroom space, scholarships, teacher salaries, school supplies, and a senior high annex so that more kids can keep learning and dreaming even bigger!

Rufus Kpana

TEACHER, CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

"I am Rufus K Kpana, and I was born in Balama Town, Bong County, Liberia in 1990 - the year that 14 years of Civil War began in my country. Because of the civil unrest, we could not go to school during our early childhood days.

When the first phase of the crisis subsided, I had the opportunity to sit in a classroom for the first time at the age of seven. My school was in Balama and it was just a preschool for children in the village with untrained teachers - of whom some were only able to complete elementary school.

When I completed the preschool in Balama in 2000, I was sent to the next school in Sinyea which was almost an hour walk from Balama. I walked this distance every morning to get to school and every afternoon to get back home as a IO year old boy. After two years of learning, the second phase of the civil crisis interrupted, and we were chased out of school to escape being harmed by soldiers.

When it was finally safe to return to Balama, I again walked the same one hour distance I covered as a kid to school and finally completed high school in 2008. After my high school graduation, I sat for another two years because there was no money to enroll at university and finally was able to attend on financial support. This fell through for me, and after two years in University, I dropped out of school.

In 2015, I received the opportunity to teach at Children's Ministry in Balama, the school founded by Daryl Roberts and LIVE254O. As God designed it, I was able to resume my university studies as a self-supported student because of this teaching opportunity. I earned a degree from Cuttington University in Secondary Education with an emphasis in Biology in 2019. I decided to become a classroom teacher because of the many challenges I met along my learning path.

Today, I am proud to be called a teacher. I'm able to provide quality learning and mentorship to many kids who are going through challenges like mine and are feeling like all hope is lost.

Childhood learning remains my deepest passion, the key to an enlightened future for our country and the world at large. Thank you for offering me this opportunity to share with you my path through preschool to university. To God be all the glory."

125 TONS OF FOOD SERVED

Because of your purposeful purchases and monthly support, we are able to feed an incredible 1,350 children a day! But the impact goes far beyond just a meal.

For more than 2 million children under the age of 18 in Liberia, childhood is challenging. Many children are undersupported and spend their time searching for their next meal, even being forced to drop out of school to work for their survival. This especially affects young girls who have a 73% dropout rate before 5th grade.

Because your support takes away the worry about where their next meal will come from, these children can focus on their education and stay in school.

Garmai

ORPHANAGE, MARGIBI

In 2017, we started providing daily food for 1,100 children who were suffering from food insecurity. Most were living in orphanges, like Garmai.

In the first picture of Garmai you'll notice her body showing signs of malnutrition. Seven years later, her body (skin and hair included) and mind are thriving.

Garmai is currently 12 years old and attends a small school. She loves drawing, coloring, and playing with her friends. Thanks to your contributions, she has stayed healthy over the years. Access to food, safe drinking water, and medicine has allowed her to commit her energy to being and kid: running, playing, and learning.





Our Pillars: Discipleship

To ensure we are partnering with missionaries and locals who are **making disciples** in their workplaces and positions of ministry.

One of LIVE254O's key pillars is discipleship. We support many mission partners who are being the hands and feet of Jesus every day in hard places. Their efforts to teach, train, and share the gospel with their community inspires our team every day.

In addition to our mission partners on the ground, our team of local Liberians expanded greatly this year, equipped with medical practitioners and construction workers whose daily work is a mission to tell others about the love of Jesus.

Your support provides warm meals and medication, but also ensures that people all over the world are coming to know a God that sees them and cares for both their needs and heart.

JESUS LOVES ME CHILDREN'S CLINIC

At 61, engineer Darryl Byles felt God calling him from his busy work life in Montana to Liberia where he would be constructing a pediatric clinic - The Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic - for thousands of children in the interior, or "bush" as locals call it.

For over 2O+ years Darryl has been running his own businesses, often having 2-3 different jobs going at the same time, until recently he felt God convicting him to "let go of the things of this world and to follow Him to Africa." Darryl took a trip to Africa with no intention other than to see what the Lord was already doing.

After spending time with some of our mission partners in Bong County, Liberia, and hearing about the plans of building a clinic for some of the most vulnerable children in the world, he committed to becoming the lead engineer of the new hospital build. Darryl has spent most of this year on-site in Liberia leading a group of 5O+ men. He's not only showing them new ways to build, but he's growing a relationship with each of them through morning devotionals and discipleship.

At the Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic site, local artist Prince Kollay stands on a ladder in the space that will be the waiting room one day soon and paints a story - the story of Jesus's life from beginning to end

We sat down with Prince last year while he showed us this concept art he was sketching on a tablet. Now, everywhere we turn, we see hope and life brought to life by his brush strokes.

"In our society, a lot of people learn by what they see, like pictures," Prince says. "God recruited me to do these drawings, and now, we have sketched Bible stories to put on these walls so everyone can learn by what they see here."

The Jesus Loves Me Children's Clinic will restore the health of an estimated 30,000 children each year, but more than that, the children treated here will be surrounded by the love of God everywhere they turn.
